REDHAWKS TEAM HISTORY

The Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks arrived in the Red River Valley in 1996 after a 35-year absence of professional baseball. The area was home to the Fargo-Moorhead Twins, a minor league affiliate of the Cleveland Indians (1934-40, 1953-1957), Pittsburgh Pirates (1947-48), and New York Yankees (1958-60), that played in the old Northern League from 1934 to 1960. The team played at Barnett Field in Fargo from 1936 until its demise and saw stars like Dizzy Dean, Lloyd Wagner, Roger Maris, Mudcat Grant, and many others play on its surface, on the site of the current Fargo North High School, over the years.



When Miles Wolff started the new Northern League in 1993, Fargo-Moorhead was immediately a target for a new franchise. Although arrangements couldn't be made in time to bring the team in for the league's first season in 1993, Gene Allen and Bruce Thom partnered to make the dream of baseball's return to the area a reality when the league initiated its first wave of expansion in 1996. A new, \$5.5 million stadium was designed and team and city officials broke ground on August 31, 1995.



The name RedHawks was chosen from a list of eight finalists and unveiled alongside the team's new uniforms on October 17, 1995. Beavers, Prairie Dogs, Pioneers, Prairie Hawks, River Rats, Roughriders, and Valley Cats were the other options. The name was submitted by Steve Bono of Moorhead.

The RedHawks joined the Northern League with the expansion Madison Black Wolf in 1996 and had immediate success under manager Doug Simunic, winning 53 games in the team's first season to tie the league record and making the Championship Series before falling to the St. Paul Saints.

After losing in the first round of the playoffs to Winnipeg in 1997, the RedHawks returned in 1998 and put together one of the greatest teams in independent baseball history. Leading almost wire to wire, the RedHawks posted a 64-21 record and set the mark for highest winning percentage (.735) in league history. Fargo-Moorhead cruised through the playoffs, beating Winnipeg (3-1) and St. Paul (3-0), to take home the franchise's first Northern League title. Baseball America would later name the 1998 RedHawks the Independent Team of the Decade for the 1990s.



The RedHawks and Newman Outdoor Field hosted their first All-Star Game in 1999, when Fargo played host to a battle between the Northern League's Central and East (formerly the Northeast League) Divisions. Chris Coste, Greg Salvevold, Mike Busch, and Aaron Jersild represented the RedHawks as the Central won the game, 7-5.



The RedHawks ran their streak of postseason appearances to six with playoff berths from 1999-2001, but were shut out of the playoffs for the first time in their history in 2002, despite a 52-37 record.

Fargo-Moorhead regrouped in the offseason and returned to the top of the Northern League in 2003. After a 62-28 regular season, the RedHawks edged the Schaumburg Flyers (3-2) in the first round of the playoffs before winning their second league title in Winnipeg (3-1) against the Goldeyes in the Northern League Finals. The 2004 RedHawks again advanced to the postseason before falling to St. Paul (3-1) in the Division Finals.

In 2005, the RedHawks dominated the regular season, winning a league-record 68 games and posting an incredible 40-7 mark in the second half. The 'Hawks rattled off a league-record 14-game winning streak from Aug. 17-Sept. 1. Despite the gaudy numbers, the RedHawks fell to Gary (3-2) in the Championship Series.

The 2006 RedHawks got revenge for the 2005 season, defeating Gary (3-1) in the Northern League Finals to take home the team's third championship. The 2006 'Hawks posted a 63-33 record and landed three players on the Northern League All-Star Team, including league MVP Joe Mathis.

2007 saw Fargo-Moorhead win the Northern League North Division second half title and finish with the second-best overall record in the league (57-38) before being swept in the first round of the playoffs by the Calgary Vipers. Joe Mathis was again selected to the Northern League All-Star Team, and Mike Just was named Rookie of the Year. In addition, Mathis was named the league's top defensive player, while closer Nate Cotton earned Relief Pitcher of the Year honors.

The RedHawks hosted the Northern League All-Star Game at Newman Outdoor Field for the second time in 2007, with Richard Austin, Adam Shorsher, Kory Wayment, Darryl Lawhorn, Dane Renkert, Jason Schutt, Adam Rowe, and Joe Mathis (injured, did not play) selected to represent the North Division and Doug Simunic managing. The South Division defeated the North Division 7-5

In 2008, the RedHawks posted the top record in the regular season, going 62-34. Despite the club's regular season success, Fargo-Moorhead was swept out of the first round of the playoffs for the second consecutive season, this time by the Kansas City T-Bones. Three members of the RedHawks were named to the Northern League All-Star Team: catcher Alan Rick, second baseman Carlo Cota, and outfielder Steve Mortimer. Joe Mathis earned his second consecutive Defensive Player of the Year Award and Billy Weitzman was named the Rookie Pitcher of the Year. Manager Doug Simunic was selected Manager of the Year for the sixth time, while GM Josh Buchholz was named Executive of the Year.

2009 brought a fourth Northern League Championship season to the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks organization. Behind N.L. Most Valuable Player Nic Jackson, RedHawks went 53-42 and finished 3rd in the regular season. The RedHawks

advanced to the Championship round by taking Game 5 of a Best-of-Five series against the Winnipeg Goldeyes. After losing Game 1 of the NL Finals to the Gary SouthShore RailCats, the RedHawks won three straight to take the series three games to one. LHP Jeremy Hauer was named the Championship Series MVP. Catcher Alan Rick and Outfielder Nic Jackson were each named to the 2009 All-Independent League Teams.

The 2010 Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks were able to put their stamp on the Northern League with their NL record 5th (and second

consecutive) Championship season. A 61-39 record was tops in the Northern League and the RedHawks swept through the playoffs, with T.J. Stanton finishing off the Kansas City T-Bones with a 14-strikeout, one-hit complete game shutout to win the title in front of the hometown fans. RHP Casey Hoorelbeke was named the NL Relief Pitcher of the Year, Doug Simunic won NL Manager of the Year, and GM Josh Buchholz took home his second Executive of the Year award.

In late 2010, the RedHawks announced that the team would move to the American Association of Professional Baseball for the 2011 season. The RedHawks posted their first losing record in team history (44-56) and missed the playoffs for only the second time in franchise history.

The RedHawks won back-to-back North Division titles in 2012 and 2013, but were defeated in the opening round of the playoffs by the eventual champions (Winnipeg in 2012, Gary SouthShore in 2013) both seasons. Zach Penprase and Ryan Delgado were named All-Stars in 2012, Nic Jackson was named the league's Player of the Year and Star of Stars, Tom Boleska earned Relief Pitcher of the Year honors, and Josh Buchholz received his third Executive of the Year honor. Taylor Stanton was named the American Association Pitcher of the Year in 2013.

Fargo-Moorhead hit a cold snap in 2014, missing the playoffs for five consecutive seasons. Prior to the streak, the franchise had only missed the postseason twice in 16 seasons of play. Legendary manager Doug Simunic was let go by the team in August 2017 in the midst of his 22nd season with the club. He amassed a 1202-839 record and five league championships in 2,041 games over 22 seasons with the RedHawks.

Jim Bennett led the RedHawks back to the playoffs in 2019, finishing second in the North Division with a 63-37 record. Fargo-Moorhead won the first two games of the best-of-five North Division Championship Series at Newman Outdoor Field, and LHP Tyler Pike had a perfect game through six innings of Game 3, but a flurry of hits and errors led to the Saints coming from behind and seizing momentum in the series. The Saints won all three games at CHS Field in St. Paul to come from behind and steal the series on their way to their first American Association title.

Fargo-Moorhead took part in the six-team, 60-game COVID-19 shortened season in 2020 and finished fifth with a 28-32 record under interim manager Chris Coste. Despite the unsuccessful record, Drew Ward beat teammate Correlle Prime by one thousandth of a point to win the American Association batting title.

Newman Outdoor Field has been the home of the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks since their inaugural season in 1996. The stadium was constructed at a cost of \$5.5 million by the architecture firms Sink, Combs, Dethlefs and R.L. Engebretson P.C. The new stadium hosted its first game on June 21, 1996 when the Sioux Falls Canaries beat the RedHawks 13-11.

The Fargo Baseball Stadium, affectionately known as “The Nest” when it opened in 1996, also hosts North Dakota State baseball games during the spring. The 4,513-seat facility was renamed Newman Outdoor Field in 1998 when Harold Newman’s Newman Outdoor Advertising purchased the stadium’s naming rights for \$1.5 million. Since opening the gates in 1996, Newman Outdoor Field has welcomed more than four million baseball fans through its doors.

In an homage to former New York Yankee great Roger Maris, who played for the Fargo-Moorhead Twins in the 1950s, the dimensions of Newman Outdoor Field’s outfield walls are a carbon copy of the original Yankee Stadium’s. The park’s dimensions — 318’ to left field, 399’ to left-center field, 408’ to center, and 314’ to right field — create an alley in left-center field that keeps long fly balls inside the stadium and can be an advantage for pitchers. On the other hand, the short right field fence (314’ down the right field line) makes for an appealing target for left-handed hitters. The field’s surface is natural grass.

Dressing rooms are located under the stadium behind each dugout, and there is an indoor batting cage. A two-tiered press box with radio and television booths provides ample working space high above home plate between 12 spectator suites. The LED video board measuring 26 feet wide and 13 feet high in left field features highlights, in-game videos, and instant replays and is accompanied by a digital scoreboard.

Newman Outdoor Field has hosted numerous events over the past two decades, from concerts and the annual Fargo Blues Fest to the 2009 American Legion World Series, the 1999 and 2007 Northern League All-Star Games and, of course, RedHawks and NDSU baseball.

Chris Coste was officially named the fourth manager in RedHawks history on April 21, 2021 after serving as the team's interim manager during the 2020 season. He previously served in the team's hitting coach and bench coach roles during the 2018 and 2019 seasons.

Coste, a Concordia College (Moorhead, Minn.) graduate, pitched and played third base for the Cobbers from 1993 to 1995. He earned three consecutive All-American awards and still holds the school record for career batting average and ERA. Coste helped the Cobbers win the MIAC championship in 1995 and finish second at the NCAA Midwest Regional — the 1995 squad is the only Concordia team to win 30 games in a single season. He was inducted into the Concordia Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007.

He started his professional career in 1995 playing for the Brainerd Bears in the North Central League and the Brandon Grey Owls in the Prairie League. The Fargo native played for the RedHawks from the team's start in 1996 until 1999. He was named to the Northern League All-Star Team in 1997, 1998, and 1999 and helped lead the RedHawks to the team's first Northern League title in 1998. Coste had a .322 batting average with 429 hits, 44 home runs and 221 RBIs in 335 games with the RedHawks. In 1999, Coste was signed by the Pittsburgh Pirates but was released after spring training and returned to the RedHawks. His contract was purchased by the Cleveland Indians in 2000, and he spent six seasons in the minor leagues before making his MLB Debut for the Philadelphia Phillies on May 26, 2006 against the Milwaukee Brewers.

Coste won a World Series championship with the Philadelphia Phillies in 2008 and became the first





player from the Division III Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) to win a World Series ring. He played in affiliated baseball for the Phillies, Houston Astros, Milwaukee Brewers, Boston Red Sox, and Cleveland Indians organizations. All in all, Coste appeared in 299 Major League Baseball combined between the Phillies and Astros and had a career MLB average of .272.

Following his retirement as a player, Coste served as an in-studio analyst on Comcast SportsNet, appearing on the Phillies pregame and postgame shows. He has served as the head coach at Concordia since 2014, compiling a 108-92 record in seven seasons with the Cobbers. In 2017, Coste was the head coach of the West Fargo Patriots American Legion team and led them to a state tournament berth.

Coste has written two books about his experiences in professional baseball: "Hey... I'm Just the Catcher: An Inside Look at a Northern League Season From Behind the Plate," published in 1997 and "The 33-Year-Old Rookie: How I Finally Made it to the Big Leagues After Eleven Years in the Minors." The book, which chronicles Coste's first season in the majors, contains a foreword by John Kruk.

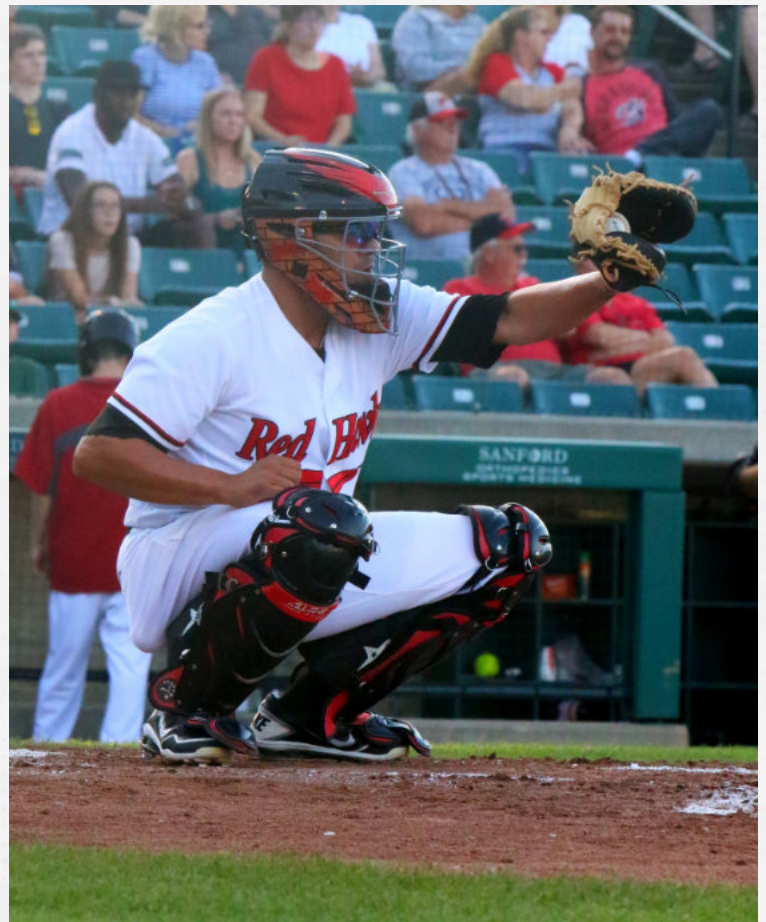

Bret Helton returns to Fargo for his seventh season of professional baseball and third as a RedHawk in 2021 after a solid performance in 2020 with Fargo-Moorhead in the COVID-19-shortened season. Primarily acting as a reliever out of the bullpen, Helton went 4-3 with a 3.46 ERA in 17 appearances (3 starts) for the 'Hawks last season. He struck out 32 batters and walked 19 while giving up 15 earned runs in 39.0 innings of work. Helton limited opponents to two hits or fewer in 13 of his 17 appearances last season. His best outing of 2020 came on August 15 against the Chicago Dogs when he pitched 5.0 innings of two-hit ball, giving up one unearned run and striking out four, to help the RedHawks to a 2-1 win at Newman Outdoor Field.

Helton started 17 games for the RedHawks in 2019 with a record of 6-7 and a 4.40 ERA. He struck out 64 batters, walked 47, and gave up 44 earned runs in 90.0 innings pitched. The American Association named Helton the Pointstreak Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 23, 2019 after he pitched 12.2 innings of shutout baseball across two starts. After he was drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 2015 MLB Draft, Helton spent four seasons in organized baseball with the Pirates, reaching Double-A in 2018, before coming to Fargo-Moorhead.

He played three seasons for the University of Utah, compiling a 4-12 record with a 5.68 ERA in 39 appearances from 2013-15. Majored in Business Administration. In high school, Helton was a two-time all-state player and helped Cheyenne Mountain (Colorado Springs, Colo.) to Colorado Class 4A state baseball titles in 2009 as a freshman and 2011 as a junior. Gage Hinsz arrives with the RedHawks in 2021 for his sixth season of professional baseball and first in independent baseball. Hinsz played four seasons in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization after they took him in the 11th Round of the 2014 MLB Amateur Draft. He reached the Advanced-A level in 2017 with the Bradenton Marauders, going 5-5 with a 5.61 ERA in 20 appearances (19 starts). He struck out 52 batters and gave up 31 walks in 94.2 innings pitched in 2017, his most recent season of summer baseball, despite missing parts of the season with a shoulder injury that was eventually diagnosed as a scapular stress fracture. He was listed as the Pirates' 20th-ranked prospect on MLB.com's 2018 prospect watch list.

After undergoing open heart surgery to repair a failing aortic valve in May 2018, Hinsz returned to baseball during the instructional league in Florida and then at Pittsburgh's academy in the Dominican Republic, where he pitched simulated games before joining Gigantes de Carolina in the Puerto Rican Winter League. Hinsz made his first official appearance since his surgery Nov. 17, 2018, when he struck out five over four scoreless innings and allowed one hit and one walk. He went 0-1 with a 1.08 ERA in five starts for Carolina in 2018-19, striking out 23 batters and walking seven in 25.0 innings of work. He was placed on the injured just prior to the start of the 2019 season with a right forearm strain and did not make any appearances that season.

Hinsz pitched for the Billings Scarlets American Legion team — his high school did not have a baseball team — before being drafted by the Pirates. He committed to Oregon State while he was in high school, but decided on playing minor league baseball after being offered a \$580,000 signing bonus in 2014. Models his mechanics after Roy Halladay.

Austin Ver Steeg begins his journey in professional baseball with the RedHawks in 2021. A 2020 graduate of Concordia College (Moorhead, Minn.), Ver Steeg was a four-year letterman for head coach Chris Coste and the Cobbers in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC), making 27 appearances (23 starts) over his four-year career in the maroon and gold, compiling a career 12-8 record and 2.14 ERA in 142.2 innings while recording 117 strikeouts and 38 walks. Hope was dealt to the Sussex County Miners on January 15, 2020 in a trade that sent LHP Aaron Ford, INF Jake Vieth, and himself to the New Jersey club in exchange for INF Trey Hair, but did not play in 2020 due to the Frontier League canceling its season as a result of the pandemic. Hope made 31 relief appearances for the RedHawks in 2019, finishing with an 8-0 record and a 3.47 ERA in 59.2 innings of work with 46 strikeouts and one save. He also had seven at-bats for Fargo-Moorhead in 2019, picking up three hits, including a two-run home run on July 26, 2019 in an 8-7 win on the road against the Lincoln Saltdogs.

A management major at Shippensburg University, Hope was twice (2017, 2019) named an All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division second team member. Mark Finkelburg joins the RedHawks for his first season of professional baseball after a five-year collegiate career capped off by two seasons with the St. Louis University Billikens. He made 12 appearances for the Billikens in 2021 as a COVID redshirt senior, pitching to a 4.53 ERA with 50 strikeouts and 22 walks with an 0-8 record in 55.2 innings pitched. He threw a six-inning complete game without giving up an earned run in his season debut on Feb. 20 at Kennesaw State. The accounting major was named to the Atlantic-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll for both seasons he played at St. Louis.

Luke Lind joins the RedHawks for his third season of professional baseball and first in independent baseball after playing two seasons in the Los Angeles Angels farm system. He reached Advanced-A with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2019, his most recent professional season. He made 35 appearances in 2019 split between Inland Empire and the Single-A Burlington Bees, going 4-5 with a 3.16 ERA and 69 strikeouts to 25 walks in 57.0 innings pitched with a 1.333 WHIP. He made his pro debut on June 26, 2017 for the AZL Angels — game time temperature for his pro debut was 108 degrees in Tempe, Ariz. Over his two seasons with the Angels organization, Lind averaged 12.4 strikeouts per nine innings pitched. He missed the 2018 season with an oblique injury. He was released by the Angels organization one June 5, 2020.

The North Dakota State alumnus signed a minor league contract with the Los Angeles Angels on June 21, 2017 after playing four seasons for the Bison. He tied the NDSU single season strikeout record in 2017 as a senior with 92 punchouts in 82.2 innings pitched while going 5-4 with a 4.79 ERA and only 24 walks in 82.2 innings pitched. Lind threw two complete-game shutouts and tossed NDSU's first one-hitter since 2002 (Mike Peschel, another future RedHawks pitcher, threw that one) at South Dakota State on April 28. He held opponents to a .230 batting average over his collegiate career. He went 4-2 with a 5.01 ERA in 13 appearances as a junior in 2016 and had a strikeout to walk ratio of 25 to 16 in 23.1 innings of work. In 2015, Lind appeared in six games out of the bullpen, throwing 9.1 innings on the mound with a 5.79 ERA. Majored in university studies.

Lind was a three-year starter and two-time letterwinner for the Eagles and helped them to a third-place finish at the 2012 MSHSL Class AAA State Baseball Tournament. He batted .350 with 13 home runs and drove in 26 runs in 46 games for the 2013 Eden Prairie American Legion team and was named the tournament MVP after helping his team to the Minnesota state championship. Also played hockey at Eden Prairie. His dad, Roger, was inducted into the Concordia-St. Paul Hall of Fame for football and baseball in 2010. Has a younger sister, Erin.

Tevin Murray joins the RedHawks for his first season of professional baseball after a five-year career at Rutgers. Murray, 23, appeared in nine games for the Scarlet Knights in 2021 after taking advantage of his extra year of NCAA eligibility due to COVID. He struck out eight batters and limited opponents to a .233 average in 8.2 innings pitched. Over 54 appearances (16 starts) at Rutgers, Murray was 6-8 with a 4.97 ERA and 135 strikeouts in 117.2 innings pitched.

Perhaps his best collegiate season came in 2019, when Murray made 17 appearances and earned a 3.01 ERA. He led the Rutgers pitching staff with his ERA, a 1.26 WHIP, and a .200 opponent batting average. He finished third in the Big Ten with a 1.75 ERA in conference play over eight starts and 46.1 innings. It was the best conference ERA for a qualifying Rutgers starter this century and second only behind Rob Corsi's 1.27 mark in 12 relief stints in 2011 in the Big East. Five of Murray's eight conference outings went without permitting an earned run and 7-of-8 saw two earned runs or less. He was also named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on April 15, 2019 after striking out nine over six one-hit, scoreless innings to beat Michigan State. Majored in labor studies and employment relations.

Murray played three seasons as a varsity starter for North Schuylkill (Ashland, Pa.). He was named first-team all-region at pitcher and first base and posted an 11-6 record with a 2.91 ERA over 30 appearances for the Spartans. He also hit .363 with 25 RBIs and 46 runs scored in 75 games played at the dish. Also played football and basketball in high school. Was an all-state selection in football as a wide receiver. Ryan Flores returns to Fargo-Moorhead for his fifth season of professional baseball and second with the RedHawks. He appeared in 16 games for Fargo-Moorhead in 2020 after being signed on July 19, 2020. He made three appearances for the Winnipeg Goldeyes at the start of the season after being selected by the Goldeyes from Sioux City in Round 8 of the American Association Dispersal Draft — he was released on July 13. Combined, Flores made 19 appearances, all out of the bullpen, in 2020, going 0-2 with a 5.17 ERA in 31.1 innings pitched and finishing eight games. He struck out four batters, walked two, gave up two home runs, and gave up 13 earned runs last season. Flores held opponents hitless in 10 of his 19 appearances in 2020.

In 2018, Flores played in the Australian Baseball League for the Perth Heat, posting a 4.65 ERA with 29 strikeouts in 31.0 innings. He also made one appearance for Diablos Rojos del Mexico in the Triple-A Mexican League in 2019. In 158 appearances (8 starts) over four seasons, Flores has a combined 17-17 record with a 4.21 ERA, 284 strikeouts, 140 walks, eight saves, and 46 games finished.

Flores played two seasons of college baseball at Richland College from 2015-16, going a combined 5-3 with a 4.36 ERA, 85 strikeouts, and one save for the ThunderDucks in 95.0 innings pitched over 24 games (13 starts). In 2016, Flores played for the Savannah Bananas in the collegiate summer wood bat Coastal Plain League, going 4-0 with 3 saves and a 2.21 ERA in 36.2 innings pitched.

Brent Jones returns to the RedHawks in 2021 for his sixth season of professional baseball and third in Fargo-Moorhead. The Cornell graduate appeared in 16 games last season for the RedHawks, going 1-1 with a 2.66 ERA and 21 strikeouts in 23.2 innings pitched. His 2.66 ERA was the lowest among RedHawks pitchers, despite the low inning count. Jones held opponents to three hits or fewer in all but one of his 16 appearances last season. In 2019, Jones made 39 appearances, all in relief, for Fargo-Moorhead and went 0-4 with a 3.10 ERA. In 40.2 innings of work, Jones allowed 33 hits, 14 earned runs, struck out 53 batters, and walked 18.

After playing college baseball at Cornell, Jones was drafted by the Diamondbacks in the 4th Round of the 2014 MLB Draft. He played two seasons in the Arizona farm system and reached the Single-A level with the Kane County Cougars in 2015 before taking a two-year break from professional baseball. Jones returned to baseball in 2018 with the Sussex County Miners of the Can-Am League and made 11 relief appearances before signing with Fargo-Moorhead ahead of the 2019 season.

Jones became the highest selection from Cornell at the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft, when the Arizona Diamondbacks picked him in 2014. He became a hot commodity in scouting circles after throwing 96 mph during the Big Red's Scout Day in the fall, then backed it up with an impressive senior season as one of the team's top starters. Jones led the team with nine starts, posting a 2.50 earned-run average with 47 strikeouts next to just 13 walks in 50.1 innings. He gave up only one home run during his collegiate career. Jones majored in engineering at Cornell.

Jones was selected as an All-District pitcher in high school at Albuquerque Academy, an All-Metro pitcher and outfielder and All-State pitcher in New Mexico — all first-team honors as a senior. He was named an AP Scholar with Honor and is an accomplished musician, being selected for the New Mexico All-State Guitar Ensemble.

He had a 14-game hitting streak from July 18 to Aug. 10 for the Boulders, 35 multi-hit games and was named the Can-League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 13, 2018. He picked up four hits on July 12 in an 8-5 loss at Quebec.

Originally selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 9th Round of the 2014 MLB Amateur Draft, Krause started his professional career with the short-season Single-A Jamestown Jammers in 2014 and hit .276/.363/.560 in 39 games. He missed the 2015 season due to a partial UCL tear and had Tommy John surgery in June of that year. He returned midseason in 2016 with an All-Star campaign for the West Virginia Black Bears in the New York-Penn League, hitting .273/.400/.369 with 48 hits, six doubles, a triple, three home runs, and 20 RBIs in 52 games. In his last full season with the Pirates organization in 2017, Krause hit .276/.370/.459 with 78 hits, 43 RBIs, 18 doubles, and 10 home runs in 86 games for the Advanced-A Bradenton Marauders despite missing time with a hamstring injury. He appeared in two games for the Double-A Altoona Curve in 2018 before being released.

Krause appeared in 135 collegiate games and was a two-time All-American for Stony Brook, hitting .273/.377/.453 with 153 hits, 97 RBIs, 31 doubles, and 11 home runs over three seasons. He helped lead the Seawolves to their first College World Series appearance in 2012, knocking off LSU in Baton Rouge, La. in the NCAA Super Regional. The 2012 Stony Brook team was only the second No. 4 seed to win a Super Regional — the other, Fresno State in 2008, also featured a future RedHawks player (Tommy Mendonca, 2018). He majored in healthcare administration and management. Krause played high school baseball at Tottenville High School on Staten Island, N.Y.

Dylan Kelly returns for his second season with the RedHawks and eighth season of professional baseball in 2021. He joined the RedHawks in 2020 after being selected from Sioux City in the 4th Round of the American Association Dispersal Draft and was the number one guy behind the plate from the start of the season. Kelly hit .336/.361/.493 with 47 hits, 21 RBI, seven doubles, and five home runs in 140 at-bats. He stole one base and was walked five times in 2020. Kelly caught 35 games (58-percent of Fargo-Moorhead's games) in the COVID-shortened 2020 season after catching 93 and 87 games, respectively, in the 2019 and 2018 seasons for the Sioux City Explorers to lead the American Association. Kelly has been solid in the field his entire career, sporting a .996 fielding percentage behind the dish in his career.

After going undrafted out of the University of Missouri, Kelly made his professional debut for the Normal CornBelters of the Frontier League in 2014. At one point in the season he had an 18-game on-base streak and finished his college career on an 11-game hitting streak. In high school, Kelly played varsity baseball all four years, hit .386 with 10 home runs, and was named All-Region three times. Correlle Prime returns to Fargo-Moorhead in 2021 for his third season with the RedHawks and 10th season of professional baseball. Prime has been rock solid the RedHawks' batting order over the past two seasons, hitting .321/.358/423 with 203 hits, 22 home runs, and 108 RBIs in 157 appearances for Fargo-Moorhead. Prime was locked in a great battle with teammate Drew Ward for the batting title in 2020, eventually finishing second in the race by just two ten thousandths of a point. All in all, Prime finished the 2020 season hitting .335/.361/423 with 83 hits, 31 RBIs, eight doubles, and four home runs. He had a fantastic 2019 season for the RedHawks that earned him an AA All-Star spot and saw him lead the team in home runs, RBIs, runs scored, and doubles. In total, Prime hit .312/.356/522 with 120 hits, 77 RBIs, 25 doubles, 18 home runs, and 78 runs scored over 97 games in 2019. He played all five games of the NDCS against St. Paul in 2019, going 5-for-20 with a home run and three RBIs in the series.

Originally selected by the Colorado Rockies in the 12th Round of the 2012 MLB Amateur Draft, Prime spent two seasons in rookie ball before advancing to Double-A, where he played three seasons split between the Colorado and Texas organizations. Prime spent seven seasons in affiliated baseball before signing with the Texas AirHogs midway through the 2018 season. He hit .279/.342/431 with 16 doubles, 42 RBIs, four triples, and seven home runs for a team that went 25-74. Prime was invited to spring training with the Winnipeg Goldeyes in 2019, but was cut before the start of the season and picked up by the RedHawks. Prime pitched and played first base during a three-year stint at Manatee H.S. that included three trips to the regional playoffs, a pair of district titles and a berth in the 2011 Florida Class 5A state final four. He was selected to play in the FACA North-South All-Star Games after his senior season in 2012. He was signed to play college baseball at the State College of Florida, but elected to sign with Colorado for \$190,000 after he was drafted in 2012.

John Silviano joins the RedHawks for the 2021 season, his ninth in professional baseball and first with the RedHawks, after playing primarily first base for the St. Paul Saints in each of the past two seasons. Silviano played a crucial role in the Saints' championship run in 2019, including in the NDCS against the RedHawks. He signed with the RedHawks on April 7. The Delray Beach, Fla. native hit .231/.301/.444 in 58 games for the Saints in 2020 with 52 hits and 40 RBIs. He tied for sixth in the AA with 14 home runs last season.

Selected in the 13th Round of the 2012 MLB Amateur Draft by the Blue Jays, Silviano played 80 games over three seasons in the Toronto organization. Upon being released by the Blue Jays, Silviano took a rare path back to the minors. He went to school at Division II Lynn University (Boca Raton, Fla.). He had previously signed with the North Florida University Ospreys (Jacksonville, Fla.) in 2011, but decided on pro ball after being drafted. By rule, he needed to sit out the 2015 year and could play in 2016. In his lone year at Lynn University in 2016, he hit .405/.528/.950 with 31 home runs and 76 RBIs in 51 games. In 200 at-bats, he scored 70 runs, 14 doubles, and one triple. He set single-season school records for home runs, total bases (190), slugging, and RBIs. His 31 home runs in a single season were also the third most in a career. Silviano was named 1st Team All-America and 1st Team All-Conference at catcher by ABCA/Rawlings, Daktronics/D2CCA and NCBWA and was the South Region Player of the Year. He took business and sports management course work. He returned to organized baseball with the Marlins organization in 2016 and played four more seasons in the minors, reaching the Double-A level with the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp in 2018-19 before being released midway through the 2019 season and signing with St. Paul. In high school at Summit Christian H.S. (West Palm Beach, Fla), Silviano led the Saints to a Florida Class 1A State Championship during his junior year in 2011. During the team's championship season in 2011, every member of the Summit Christian lineup batted over .300.

Alex Boxwell returns for his fourth season of professional baseball and third with the RedHawks. In his fourth year of pro ball, 2021 will be the first time that Boxwell has the chance to experience a normal May start to the season. Boxwell hit .246/.282/.415 with eight doubles, 10 RBIs, and four home runs in 34 games for the RedHawks in 2020. The Coon Rapids, Minn. native made his professional debut with the St. Paul Saints in 2018 after graduating from the University of Minnesota and got one at-bat against the Chicago Dogs on Aug. 25, 2018 to make his pro debut. He was signed by the Gary SouthShore RailCats before the 2019 season, but was released after aggravating a shoulder injury. He re-signed with the RailCats and appeared in three games before being released on July 18. He originally signed with the RedHawks on Aug. 17, 2019 and took advantage of limited playing time to stick around and earn a spot on the 2020 roster.

Boxwell went undrafted after playing four seasons of college baseball at the University of Minnesota from 2015-18. He hit .263/.323/.420 in 163 appearances for the Gophers with 20 doubles, seven triples, 15 home runs, 70 RBIs, and 31 stolen bases. Named to NCAA Minneapolis Regional All-Tournament team in 2018 after driving in four runs and going 2-for-3 with a double and a home run against No.19 UCLA in the NCAA Tournament. He dealt with injuries during his junior and senior seasons, a pulled hamstring in 2017 and cartilage damage and a bone bruise in 2018, that limited his playing time. In high school, Boxwell was an All-State selection, All-Metro, and Mr. Baseball finalist as a senior at Coon Rapids. He hit .506 with three home runs and 10 stolen bases as a senior and played for the Metro West in the 2014 Play Ball! Minnesota High School Baseball All-Star Series. He was on the honor roll all four years of high school and was a two-time All-Northwest Suburban Conference selection. As a junior, Boxwell hit .430 and helped the Cardinals to a State 3A semifinal berth. He hit .379 with 33 RBIs, seven doubles, five triples and four home runs for the Coon Rapids Post 334 Legion team in 2013 and .497 with nine home runs during the 2014 Legion season. He was also an All-Conference football player and basketball letterwinner. His mother, Lisa, ran hurdles at Minnesota. Both Boxwell's brothers, Tony (Concordia-St. Paul) and Brett (Anoka-Ramsey CC), played college baseball.

Jordan George returns to Newman Outdoor Field for his seventh season of professional baseball and first with the RedHawks after calling the stadium home in 2020 with the Winnipeg Goldeyes due to the pandemic. George appeared in 58 games for the Fish last season, hitting .223/.344/.364 with five doubles, seven home runs, 31 RBIs, and 21 runs scored in 184 at-bats. The Goldeyes acquired George in the 3rd Round of the AA Dispersal Draft from the Kansas City T-Bones. He appeared in one game for the T-Bones in 2019 before his contract was sold to the Kansas City Royals and he was sent to Double-A Northwest Arkansas to finish out the year.

George was drafted in the 35th Round of the 2015 MLB Amateur Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates and played four seasons in the Bucs' organization, including one MLB spring training game in 2018, before being drafted by the Chicago White Sox from the Pirates in the minor league phase of the Rule V Draft on Dec. 12, 2018. He started 2019 with the Advanced-A Winston-Salem Dash and hit .213/.373/.326 with 19 RBIs and three home runs before being released on July 22. He played five seasons (2011-15) of college baseball at Arkansas State University — he appeared in just nine games in his junior season in 2013 and 10 games in his redshirt junior season in 2014 before knee injuries shut him down and allowed him to gain an extra year of eligibility via medical redshirt. George reached base in all 55 of ASU's games in 2015, finishing his career with a 74-game on-base streak, and led all of Division I college baseball in on-base percentage (.548). In 176 appearances over five seasons for the Red Wolves, George hit .324/.461/.459 with 44 doubles, 108 RBIs, 11 home runs, and 289 total bases. He was named an NCAA All-American and earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors as a redshirt senior in 2015. He was named to the Arkansas State coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach on Jan. 22, 2021.
